# TRANSFORMED

In our staff meetings, we are now studying a section on Paul from the book, "Great Days with the Great Lives," by Charles Swindoll. Most Christians are familiar with Paul/Saul: his dramatic conversion experience, his many letters which are included in the Bible, his imprisonments and beatings, and his zeal in taking the Gospel of Jesus to the Gentiles.

What are some of the factors that transformed Paul into the outspoken, unashamed apostle for Christ?

- (1) The Scriptures reflect that Saul (Paul's Hebrew name) had a Jewish heritage. The Hebrew name Saul means "prayed for." Possibly his Jewish parents prayed to God to send them a son.
- (2) Saul was educated by the noted Jewish Rabbi, Gamaliel. Saul's in-depth education in the Jewish Torah and Scriptures would later prove to be the foundation that revealed to him the Messiah foretold throughout the scrolls he had studied so thoroughly.
- (3) Saul was born at a time that placed him in the middle of upheaval for the Church. The Jewish leaders and the Roman government were both fighting against the followers of Jesus. Saul was a leader among those persecuting the Christians.... **UNTIL**.....
- (4) A road trip to Damascus changed EVERYTHING!

Many Christians have been blessed with similar benefits Saul had – a Christian heritage and education. While most of us did not have a Damascus Road salvation experience as Paul, we still were blessed with the powerful "light" of God's Presence upon our hearts and the "voice" of God calling to our hearts. We experienced the transformation of being "spiritually blind" and having our sight restored to see spiritual truths.

But even being blessed with the heritage, education, and salvation experience, Paul taught that a constant submission to Jesus is still essential for a Christ follower...to daily die to self. Paul wrote to the Galatians: "I have been crucified with Christ; and it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself up for me." Galatians 2:20 (NASB)

"Dear Heavenly Father, transform us daily! Let us daily die to our fleshly selves and live by faith in YOU!"
