THE OBEDIENCE OF BRIEF ENCOUNTERS

In 1970, every Tuesday afternoon, our youth minister would take us skating at the Linwood Skating Rink on Flournoy Lucas Road (Gold Star Roofing now occupies that corner). "Love Grows Where My Rosemary Goes" by Edison Lighthouse would be blaring through the speakers, the strobe light would be turning and we thought we were too cool for school. And if you were wearing anything white, you would glow under the black light as strobe circles danced on the skating rink floor. Sadly, Edison Lighthouse only had one good song. They were a One-Hit Wonder.

One of my favorite heroes of the Bible is an 8-Verse Wonder who shows a tremendous amount of courage; Ananias of Damascus. In Acts 9, the Bible says Saul (Paul) was breathing threats of murder against the disciples of the Lord and had letters of persecution in his pocket. Verse 10 named Ananias a disciple, so he was probably high on Saul's list to be arrested. Saul had a heavenly experience with Christ and was struck blind on the way to Damascus.

The Lord spoke to Ananias in a vision telling him to go to Straight Street, lay hands on Saul of Tarsus and heal him of blindness. If I was Ananias, I'd be saying, "You want me to go WHERE and do WHAT to WHO? God, I'm actually hiding from that man and I've never healed anybody of anything! When I say abra-ca-dabra and nothing happens, Saul is going to kill me dead!" But the Lord reassured Ananias that Saul was already praying and was God's chosen instrument before the Gentiles and the Jews.

Ananias went to Saul, layed hands on him and reassured Saul he had been sent by Jesus to restore his sight. Also that he would be filled with the Holy Spirit. Immediately, Saul regained his sight and he was baptized.

Be careful in feeling too comfortable about where you are. Although obedience was frightening, it provided Ananias a front-row seat to a healing miracle and gave him a valuable friend for life. Ananias also witnessed Saul's transformation into the Apostle Paul who was divinely enabled to preach and write large portions of the New Testament. Paul's sermons and letters continue to draw the lost world to everlasting life. Ananias' obedience in this brief encounter yielded an eternity of supernatural results.


