If you've ever read about Charlotte Digges "Lottie" Moon, you know that three things come to mind when you hear her name: Commitment, Cookies and Christmas.

Lottie Moon was one of seven children born on a tobacco plantation in Virginia. She accepted Christ as her Savior in 1858 and helped her family maintain their estate throughout the Civil War. She attended Virginia Seminary and later received a Master of Arts degree in 1861 in Charlottesville, Virginia. They say she was only 4 feet, 4 inches tall, and mastered Latin, Greek, French, Italian and Spanish. She could read Hebrew and later became an expert in the Chinese language.

Lottie's **commitment** to missions was unwavering and she was appointed as a missionary to China in 1873 at the age of thirty-two. By 1885, she had transformed her teaching ministry into full time evangelism and her converts numbered in the hundreds. She wrote in a letter home, "As you wind your way from village to village, you feel it is no idle fancy that the Master walks beside you and you hear His voice saying gently, 'Lo! I am with you always, even unto the end.""

She often made **cookies** for the children of China and became known as the "Cookie Lady." She told the children about Jesus as they ate her delicious treats. To avoid suspicion, Lottie made a practice of acting and dressing as the Chinese did, waiting to be sought out by the locals by setting a plate of cookies in her doorway to attract the neighborhood residents.

In 1887, Lottie wrote home and proposed the week before **Christmas** be established as a time of praying for and giving to missions. Her vision became reality and the Christmas Mission Offering was eventually named after her. Throughout her missionary career, Lottie faced plague, famine, revolution and war. Unknown to her fellow missionaries, Moon shared her personal finances and food with the children in need around her, severely

affecting her physical health. They arranged for her to return to the United States, but she died en route on December 24, 1912 in the harbor of Kobe, Japan. She was 72 years old. In China, a monument to Lottie Moon was erected bearing her name, saying she was an American missionary, and the words, "How she loved us."
