The Voice of God

In 1 Samuel 3, we read about Samuel as a young boy. His mother had dedicated him to God, and he served in the temple of the Lord. Samuel had the blessed privilege of even sleeping in the temple near the Ark of the Covenant. "The lamp of God had not yet gone out, and Samuel was lying down in the temple of the LORD, where the Ark of God was." (1 Sam. 3:3) This is the setting when God called Samuel one night. On this evening, Samuel must have heard an actual, audible voice, because he went to Eli the priest, three times, asking Eli if he had called him.

Many descriptions of the Voice of God can be found throughout the Bible. Charles Swindoll describes several in his book, "Great Days with the Great Lives." He describes that Saul/Paul on the Damascus Road must have heard an audible voice because others in the group also heard something. (Acts 9:7) In Exodus 3:4, the Scriptures state that Moses heard a voice calling from the burning bush. Swindoll points out that Noah received detailed instructions for the building of the ark; but the Scriptures do not specify if the instructions were given audibly or "mind to mind." In Revelation 1:15, John states that God's Voice sounded "like the sound of rushing water." Elijah encountered God's Voice as a "gentle whisper." (1 Kings 19:12)

So what does God's Voice sound like? Should we expect to hear an audible voice? Should we receive instructions from God's mind to our mind? Should we "hear" God's voice through nature? Should we "hear" God's voice through the reading of God's Word? God's Word confirms that all of the above are some of the ways God may choose to speak.

God is so mighty and so wise, that He can speak in ANY WAY He wants to speak. We need to be LISTENING for His Voice and be ready to OBEY when God speaks, whatever His method may be.

"...the sheep listen to His voice. He calls His own sheep by name and leads them out...His sheep follow Him because they know His voice." John 10:3-4

Everyone is not called to foster or adopt, but we all have a role to play in caring for vulnerable children. In our June Business Meeting, we voted to establish a "Connect 1 Child" designated fund to purchase Twin Beds and/or cribs for families who are housing foster children at a moment's notice. Each bed, mattress and covering will cost approximately \$215. We will store several (boxed) beds here at EBC and our folks will assemble and deliver them in the city when we are contacted by the LBCH. What a blessing this ministry can be!
