Saul vs. Saul

It's amazing how the good and the "not so good" are revealed about the people in God's Word. The Bible presents the full truth; it doesn't gloss over the bad and dwell just on the good. We see an example of this as we study Old Testament Saul and the events surrounding his life recorded in 1 Samuel.

Everything started out so well. In 1 Samuel 9 and 10, we see an elaborate sequence of events (a donkey hunt!) that led to Saul meeting Samuel. The Providential Hand of God used <u>donkeys</u> to get Saul to Samuel so he could anoint him as the new king. God transformed Saul "into a different person" and He surrounded him with "valiant men whose hearts God had touched." (1 Samuel 10:6, 26) God gave Saul a military victory and confirmed Saul's kingship. (1 Samuel 11)

But by the time we reach chapter 13, things head downhill. Charles Swindoll ("Great Days with the Great Lives") states that "Saul became a victim of himself: full of pride, impatience, rebellion, jealousy, attempted murder."

We find a powerful contrast to the OT Saul when we compare him to the New Testament (NT) Saul/Paul. NT Saul/Paul began as a Christian-persecuting, self-righteous, legalistic, zealot. His life was opposite of the OT Saul. OT Saul started out "good" and deteriorated into "not so good." NT Saul/Paul started out "not so good" and was transformed into "good."

In 1 Corinthians 2:1-5. Paul reveals his heart:

"When I came to you, brothers, I did not come with eloquence or superior wisdom as I proclaimed to you the testimony about God. For I resolved to know nothing while I was with you except Jesus Christ and Him crucified. I came to you in weakness and fear, and with much trembling. My message and my preaching were not with wise and persuasive words, but with a demonstration of the Spirit's power, so that your faith might not rest on men's wisdom, but on God's power."

May a "demonstration of the Spirit's power" consume our lives, transforming us into "good" every day.


