"I thank my God upon every remembrance of you, always in every prayer of mine making request for you all with joy, for your fellowship in the gospel from the first day until now, being confident of this very thing, that He who began a good work in you will complete it until the day of Jesus Christ." (Philippians 1.3-6)

I read the story of a quiet forest dweller who lived high above an Austrian village along the eastern slopes of the Alps. He had been hired many years ago by the town council to clear away the debris from the pools of water up in the mountain crevices that fed the lovely spring flowing through their town. For many years he had served the village, faithfully removing the leaves and branches, and clearing out the silt that would otherwise choke and contaminate the fresh flow of water. By and by, the village became a popular attraction for vacationers. Swans floated along the crystal clear spring, mill wheels of various businesses along the water turned freely, farmlands were naturally irrigated, and the view from restaurants was picturesque and beyond description.

Years passed. One day the town council met for its annual meeting. As they reviewed the budget, one man's eye caught the salary figure being paid the obscure keeper of the spring. He asked their accountant, "Who is the old man, and why do we keep him on year after year? No one ever sees him. For all we know this strange old man of the hills is doing us no good. He isn't necessary any longer!" So, by a unanimous vote, they dispensed with the old man's services.

For several weeks nothing changed. By early autumn the trees began to shed their leaves. Small branches snapped off and fell into the pools, hindering the rushing flow of sparkling water. One afternoon someone noticed a slight yellow-brown tint in the spring. A couple of days later the water was much darker. Within another week, a slimy film covered sections of the water along the banks and a foul odor was soon detected. The mill wheels moved slower, and some finally ground to a halt. Then, the swans left, as did the tourists.

The embarrassed council quickly called a special meeting. Realizing their gross error in judgment, they hired back the old keeper of the spring. Within a few weeks the river that brought life to their village began to clear up. The mill wheels turned again, the swans came back, and the landscape quickly greened up. Once again, the hamlet in the Alps was full of life.

This story is more than an idle tale. It carries with it a vivid relevant analogy directly related to the church. For the church is the body of Christ, and all of its members are necessary and needful. Some of us work out in the open, and some of us work behind the scenes. But all of us are necessary, and all of us must be faithful.

Don't ever think that your part in the Lord's work is not important. God has equipped and gifted you for His service, and we need you to be faithful. Even your prayers and words of encouragement are great gifts to us, and your deeds of kindness are always appreciated. As your pastor, I thank God for all of you, and I never take any one you for granted. Thank you for being faithful to the Lord!

Some of our newer members who have not come from Southern Baptist backgrounds may be wondering about these ladies for whom we collect money three times a year - Annie Armstrong, Georgia Barnette and Lottie Moon. Rest assured that your contributions are not going to any individual. These offerings are named in honor of women who were very influential in encouraging Southern Baptists to support mission causes in an organized, cooperative way. This month begins our focus on missions in North America, named in honor of Annie Armstrong. Annie was born in Baltimore, Maryland, in 1850, and lived there until her death in 1938. Contrary to the expectations for women in her day, Annie provided significant leadership for mission causes. Among her accomplishments: started Bay View Mission for the poor and addicted; formed the Women's Missionary Union and served as its first president; led the formation of missions organizations for children; wrote over 18,000 letters in one year advocating for missions; refused a salary because she would never give to the Lord "that which costs me nothing;" supported the first black female missionaries; secured funds to relieve China missionary, Lottie Moon, who had served for 11 years without a furlough; advocated for Native Americans and poor mountain people; and much more. To date, over \$1 billion has been given through the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering to support church planting and compassion ministries in the U.S. and Canada. One hundred percent of all gifts go to support missionaries. Our goal this year is \$7,000.00. When you think of all that Annie Armstrong accomplished by herself over her lifetime, it's not much. Pray and give generously to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ right here in North America. We sure do need it!
